



Prof. Geraldine Lee Richmond, Presidential Chair and the Richard M. and Patricia H. Noyes Professor of Chemistry, the University of Oregon, USA, and President of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS). Prof Richmond received her BS in Chemistry in 1975 from Kansas State University and her PhD in 1980 at UC Berkeley in Physical Chemistry. From 1980 to 1985 she was Assistant Professor of Chemistry at Bryn Mawr College. Since 1985, she has been at the University of Oregon, first, from 1985 to 1991, as an Associate Professor of Chemistry, and since 1991 as a professor. Until 1995 she was director of the Chemical Physics Institute and from 1998 to 2001, Knight Professor of Liberal Arts and Sciences. Since 2011 she has been the Richard M. and Patricia H. Noyes Professor of Chemistry at the University of Oregon. In 2014, Richmond was elected President of the AAAS for a term beginning in February, 2015. Prof Richmond's area of research encompasses the chemical and physical processes that occur in complex surfaces and boundary layers. She has published more than 200 refereed journal papers, and has given numerous invited talks and lectures on scientific research at meetings, seminars and symposia. Among the long list of awards and honors bestowed upon Prof. Richmond are: Fellow of the American Physical Society, American Chemical Society, Association for Women in Science, and American Academy of Arts and Sciences; member of National Academy of Sciences; Presidential Appointee to the National Science Board, ACS Garvan-Olin Medal; Spiers Medal of the UK Royal Society of Chemistry; and Presidential Award for Excellence in Science and Engineering Mentoring.
